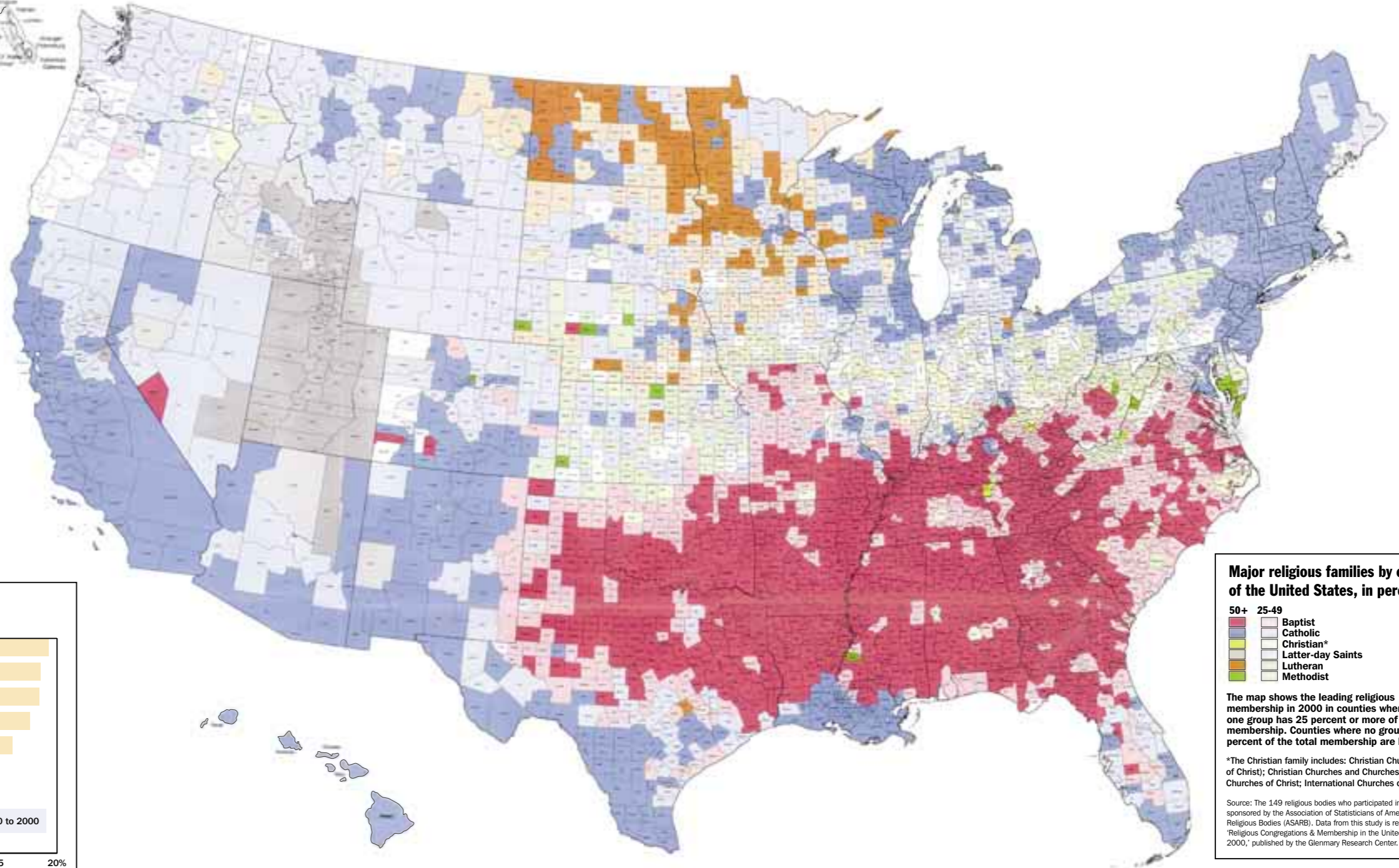
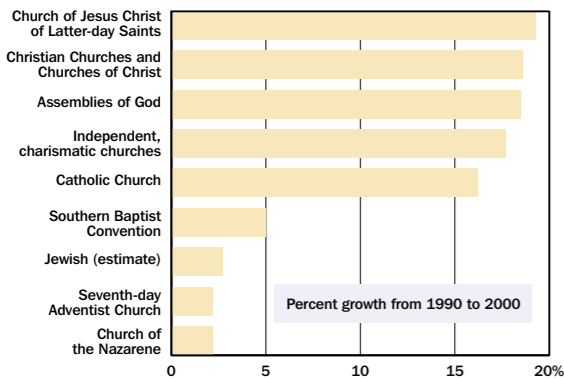

## Major religious families by counties of the United States, in percentages



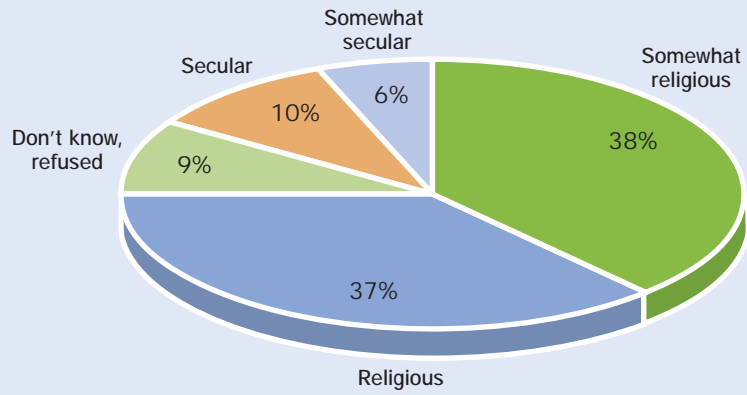

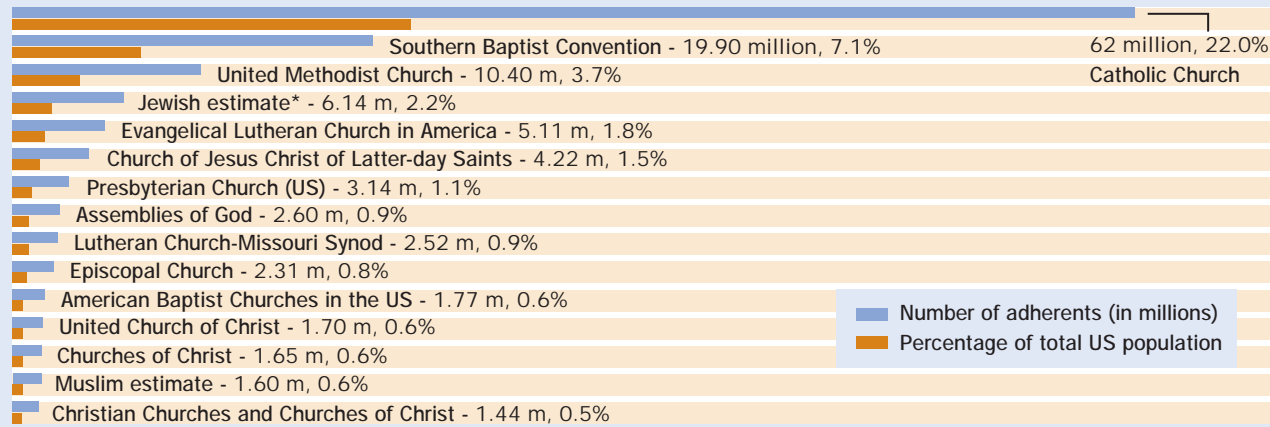
'When it comes to your outlook, do you regard yourself as...'
